- Providing individual and small-group support to help pupils access the curriculum and build confidence, communication, and independence
- Supporting pupils with sensory regulation and emotional wellbeing in our purpose-built therapeutic environment, including sensory rooms and regulation spaces
- Helping to prepare learning resources, support classroom routines, and contribute to observations that inform planning and progress tracking
- Modelling and implementing a range of autism-specific strategies in the classroom, in line with our trauma-informed and therapeutic thinking approach
- Working closely with our multidisciplinary team including therapists, teachers, and leaders
- Contributing to a whole-school culture of reflective, trauma-informed practice rooted in our ethos of "enabling the self".
